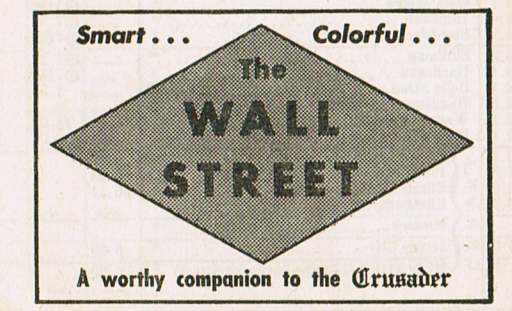

TRENTON BRANCH WESTBOUND—Trains leave Trenton (Warren St. Station) for West Trenton (4.0 m/le) Weekdays, except Holidays, at 7:07, 7:20, 10:40, A. M., 12:10 and 4:07 P. M., stopping on signal or notice to conductor at Prospect St. (0.6 miles) Hillcrest (1.6 miles), Agassiz (2.5 miles) and Ajax Park (2.8 miles). EASTBOUND—Trains leave West Trenton for Trenton, Weekdays, except Holidays, at 9:55, 11:51 A. M., 2:42, 6:07 and 6:51 P. M., stopping at all intermediate stations on signal or notice to conductor. (No Sunday or Holiday service on Trenton Branch).
